<b>DIRECTIVE TITLE:</b>	Heat Stress
<b>EFFECTIVE DATE:</b>	09/13/2007

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1. **POLICY:** It is the policy of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) that all Instructors conducting outdoor physical conditioning and overseeing outdoor physical activity will do so in a safe and prudent manner.

2. **SCOPE:** All personnel, regardless of agency or division, will abide by the guidelines set forth in this directive. Additionally, FLETC Artesia, Charleston, and Cheltenham will adhere to the guidelines in this directive, but will develop local policies regarding dissemination of heat stress information and warnings.
