

FLETC-Glynco's Intermodal Training Facility Dedicated in memory of youngest 9/11 victim

The Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers' (FLETC) Intermodal Training Facility was dedicated in August of 2011 in memory of two-year-old Christine Lee Hanson, who was on flight 175 with her parents, when it flew into the south towers.



Tuesday, September 11, 2001, was a perfect day for traveling when the Hanson family of Groton, Massachusetts, boarded United Flight 175 bound for California for a much anticipated trip to Disneyland. At 9:03:11, Flight 175 struck the south tower of the World Trade Center. Christine and her parents were killed instantly and she became the youngest victim of 9/11.

Christine's stuffed pink bunny was left at home while she was on vacation. She never returned home to her bunny, but Christine's grandparents donated it to FLETC, where it remains in a display box underneath Christine's portrait so that we never forget her, or the countless victims on that horrendous day.



The Intermodal Training Facility took approximately one year to build and it houses two airplanes, subway, bus station, ticket counter and baggage screening venues. This facility is used daily to train our nation's law enforcement officers to prevent acts of terrorism, such as those that took place on September 11.
