This training specifically addresses the operational areas of law enforcement that contribute to the greatest number of LODD's, but are in large part preventable. The Below 100 program is an effort to instill a culture of safety in law enforcement agencies that will progressively reduce national LODD's to Below 100 annually.

Drug Endangered Children is a 1-day course designed to give the investigator the tools necessary to collect, preserve and present evidence to the prosecutor to prove the crime of felony child abuse and neglect. Training topics include: recognizing the evidence of a crime, collection and preservation of evidence, understanding the methodology required for forensic interviews of children and more.
